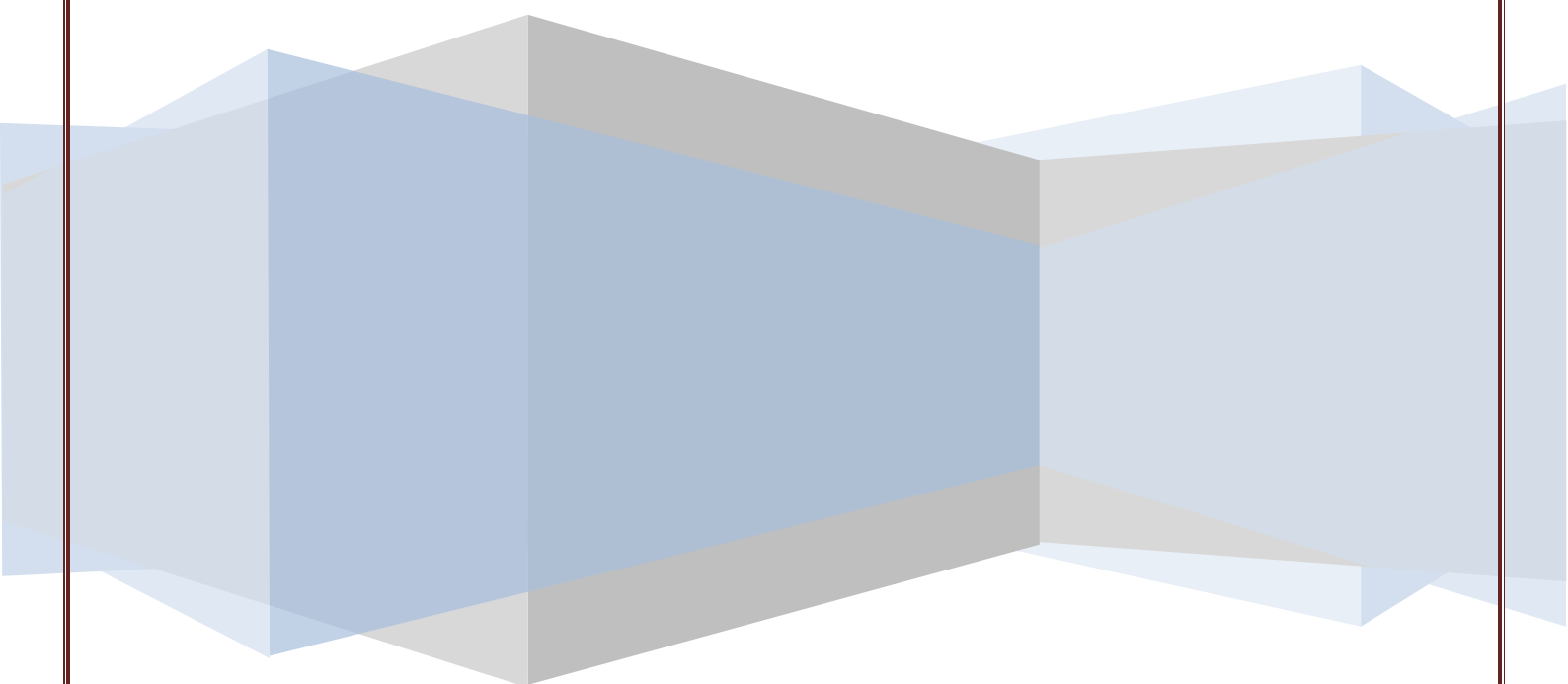

- Meetings with HODs and In-charges of Committees/Cells and planning out and drawing of Academic Calendar for 2017-18.
- Student strength increased by 122 students from 730 to 852; with 63% girl students; and 35% from socially disadvantaged sections.
- Orientation for FY students on new CBCS system & choice of subjects (16th-17th June 2017)
- Facility visit and orientation for new staff on 15th June 2017, to acquaint them with the facilities, rules and regulations of the College and their respective duties and responsibilities.
- Fresher’s Day- welcome / orientation for FY students conducted on 30th June, 2017.
- Pre-course tests class wise/subject wise held at the beginning of the academic year through individual teachers, for pre-evaluation of subject knowledge of new batches.
- Conducted class wise/subject wise pre-course departmental interaction for students in the first week of the academic year to discuss CBCS, teaching plan, syllabus and course content. Evaluation system- ISA’s, SEE, assignments and projects were also explained.
- New Executive Graduate Program (EGP) introduced; Improvement over the Honours programme started last year. This will be additional skill-based program with 8 credits (each credit of 15 hours); over 3 years student should complete 120 hours. Two programmes introduced in this academic year.

- International Conference on "*Sustainable Development Goals*" held through Department of Economics, in association with FATER Academy of India(01st to 03rd November 2017).
- In-house Journal ANCHOR granted Online ISSN "2581-3668" on 10th March 2018.
- Guidelines made for new certificate/diploma programs for departments- certificate programmes to be of 30 hours and diploma programs of 60 hours.
- Paper setting guidelines streamlined for First and Second year exams - proper scrutiny and approval of the papers to be done by the H.O.D or Subject Expert; Zero Defect Undertaking to be taken by the Paper Setters and H.O.D to ensure proper paper setting; there should be 3 signatories on the question paper namely Paper Setter, Subject Expert and H.O.D.
- Guidelines made for Student-Teacher Feedback to be conducted using Google Forms; improvement in Teacher Feedback analysis and documented; can be used for exit interview; Google form workshop conducted to give idea on Teacher Feedback.
- CREST-IQAC event towards building neighbourhood engagement and commitment launched- titled *Peace Concert 2017* with the theme *Peace in the midst of a storm*. It was held on Human Rights Day, i.e. 10th December 2017. Event included a concert, National Peace Awards to four prominent personalities; release of two books; felicitation of 110 girls from 55 wards of neighbouring panchayats for their educational achievements.
- Under Outreach Program and managed by Wellness Committee, Food Bank on College campus started to donate food to the needy and poor; inaugurated on 18th December, 2017 in collaboration with Street Providence - Goa's only '24-Hour Food Bank' for the poor.
- Upgrading the college website to make it comprehensive and functional
- Enhancing Social Media presence (regular uploading of college videos on Face book etc)
- New lesson plan and execution format (devised and implemented individually).
- Annual Report formats for departments- devised and implemented.
- New Committee list covering various quality deliverables, with each committee under NAAC criteria heads finalized and approved – to be implemented from 2018-19.
- Planning Forum budget for field visits/excursions enhanced by 2.8 times from Rs. 50,000/- to Rs. 1.4 lakhs for various Departments, to encourage teachers to use field visits as a means for learning by first hand witnessing/doing. Departments organised industrial visits, Eco-Tourism initiative experience, Historical site visits, Legislature experience etc.

- The student attendance is continuously monitored. Short fall in attendance are individually addressed by the Coordinator of the Attendance Committee, Administrator and Principal. Parents are kept informed regularly through SMS facility.
- Class wise and subject wise top students are awarded during the Annual Day to encourage other students to up performance.
- Achievements of students are published in the monthly newsletter ‘*Happenings*’ and annual magazine; in some cases the news reports or notices related to achievements of students are put in the notice board to encourage other students to up their performance.

- The Career and Placement Cell organised a Career Guidance session for TY BA/BCom/BCA students on 19th July 2017 where emphasis was laid on the requirements of the industry, the need for scoring good marks and tips to succeed at competitive exams.

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

6.2 Does the Institution have a Management Information System.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- The College is affiliated to the Goa University therefore follows the syllabus set by Board of Studies in respective subjects. As and when the update/revision is informed to the college by the Goa University, the college implements the same.
- Some of our faculty members are currently members of the Board of Studies in their respective subjects have contributed to framing/revising of the existing syllabi.
- Considering the existing industry/market demand, the College has introduced various career oriented courses, certificate courses, training programmes, internship programmes to enhance the additional skills needed for by the students to gain employment.

3.2 Teaching and Learning

- The academic calendar informs the students of the various activities and events to be held on the college which are made available in the prospectus.
- Each subject teacher prepares semester wise lesson plan (with week wise execution plan of the portion and its references) which is made available to the students in the beginning of the academic year.
- The College promotes student-centric learning by providing ICT facilities and encourages faculty to use the same.
- Guest lectures are conducted on various topics of respective subjects to students which cater to a wider perspective to the related topic.
- Field trips, industry visits, excursions, study tours during vacations are also conducted.

- Assignments are given in the form of case study, role plays, models, videos, student presentations, class discussions, quizzes, films etc.
- The students attended/participated in interclass and intercollegiate seminars and workshops and other events.
- Fast learners are engaged as resource persons to teach school students from neighbouring schools under extension activities.
- Faculty Improvement Programme is conducted to empower the teachers with new methods on teaching and other related areas.
- Feedback is conducted on respective subjects of teacher's evaluation at the end of each academic year; corrective measures are taken to improve on the teaching methods.
- Organised seminars, workshops, guest lectures for faculty and students.

3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- The tentative dates of examination schedule for all streams are informed to the students in the beginning of the academic year.
- Since it is a continuous evaluation system, we adopt various methods to conduct internal assessment like tests (objective, long, short questions- answers), assignments (presentations, case studies, open book tests, quizzes etc.)
- The internal evaluation of the various subjects is regularly appraised to the students and displayed on the notice board.
- The exam evaluation is a transparent process wherein the students can avail of revaluation/ re-verification services as per the Goa University ordinances.
- In order to handle mal-practices the college has established an Unfair means Committee.
- The project work carried out by Third year students (individually/group) in their respective subjects as a part of the curriculum enhances their research skills, helps to gain extra knowledge, helps in team building and to acquire leadership qualities.
- The computerisation has ensured the easy conduct of examinations and timely declaration of results of first year and second year students of all streams.
- Exam related matters like timetable, payment of fees etc. informed/displayed on notice boards well in advance.
- Question banks and copy of the past question papers in all subjects are made available in the library to the students.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- Research Centre set up in Commerce with PhD guide from College; four students pursuing PhD at present.
- Details along with application forms which are sponsored through UGC grants and other research funding agencies are made available to the faculty.
- Established Research & Development Committee to promote various research related activities such as workshops, training and publishing of the research journal '*ANCHOR*'.
- The faculty is encouraged to participate in State, National and International conferences, seminars, symposia, workshops etc.
- Students are encouraged to participate in inter-class/-collegiate seminars, workshops etc.

- The faculty is encouraged to present and publish their research work in refereed journals at State, National and International conferences, seminars and symposia.
- Faculty is encouraged to pursue doctoral/post-doctoral programmes on full/part time basis
- Adjustments of lectures, supervisions are done for facilitating research activities.
- The College has a well-equipped computer laboratory with internet connectivity and library facilities to supplement in the research activities carried by faculty and students.
- The students are encouraged to present papers in their related areas at inter-class/-collegiate seminars. The faculty assists the students in the preparation of the papers.
- As per the curriculum designed by Goa University, the TY students have to compulsorily submit a research project in their related stream. The faculty is assigned to guide the students individually or in groups to complete the same.

- The members of the alumni participate in various functions of the college and come as jury for the events, guest lectures, coaches and as chief guest for functions.
- The Alumni sponsors/contributes to the financial aid of students.
- The ex-students have also contributed for endowment prizes.
- The ex-students sponsor prizes and trophies for felicitating meritorious students.
- On various occasions, the ex-students share their experience with the students.
- The alumni association supplements or provides donations for various events/programme.
- The members of the association and other ex-students take initiative to provide information of job opportunities available for the current students.

6.12 Activities and support from the Parent – Teacher Association

- Parent Teacher meeting is held per semester. In the meeting, various matters pertaining to the college such as attendance, academics, facilities etc. are discussed.
- Issues/Suggestions have been verbally communicated by the parents and are considered by the association and scrutinized by the higher authorities and accordingly initiated.
- SMS facility also helps to keep close contact with the parents and enables the college to inform them of the various activities taking place in the college.
- The parents participate in many events organised by the college such as Annual Day etc.

6.13 Development programmes for support staff

- Computer training given to few support staff.
- Training given to certain support staff to handle equipment such as Xerox, cyclostyle, sound system, generator etc. by senior staff.
- Annual staff fellowship programmes held at each semester of the academic year and staff members are felicitated for their achievements.
- Annual Staff picnic conducted every year.
- Faculty development programme conducted for staff.

6.14 Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly

- Use of LED bulbs and tube lights for energy conservation.
- The college has instituted 'Best Civic Sense class Award' every semester that is based on the criteria of switching off all lights, fans and keeping the classroom clean.
- Segregation of dry and wet waste
- Dustbins placed at various places - classrooms, staffrooms, office, laboratories etc.
- Paper recycling is done in the form of paper shredding which is then given to paper scrap dealers. The paper collection is done with the help of the NSS unit.
- E-waste given to dealers who deal with collection and recycling of e-waste materials.
- Planting of plants/sapling of various trees around the college and proper maintenance of the same.
- Availability of water cooler facility for drinking purpose for students and staff to avoid the usage plastic bottled water.
- Vermi-composting unit for treating bio-degradable waste
- Collection of plastic bottles, milk packet from various localities by the NSS unit of the college and sent for recycling.
- Encourage minimum use of plastic, plastic cups replaced with porcelain cups, plastic files replaced by thick paper files etc.
- Campus cleaning organised twice in each semester by NSS unit of the college
- Awareness campaigns organised to sensitize on environment
- 2nd October cleaning drive campaign organised; rooms, lobbies, laboratories, and campus cleaning carried out by the staff and students on this day.
- Minimum use of AC (only in computer laboratories) helps in reducing the carbon emissions.
- Switching of electric gadgets when not in use helps toward energy conservation.

Criterion – VII

Innovations and Best Practices

7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Give details.

I: Farm to Fork Initiative for local farmers:

Goal: To encourage farmers from neighbouring villages to increase output of local organic vegetables through ready availability of a market and thus to earn more revenue.

Context: Villages surrounding Pilar are conducive for growing fruits and vegetables. With growing concerns on the quality of the vegetables arriving in the state that are laden with hazardous chemicals and pesticides, freshly produced organic local varieties can be promoted to hotels who in turn can advertise it to their guests as a healthy practice of the hotel.

Practice: The college has approached Hotel Marriot with the idea of getting organic produce as well as taking the advantage of the program as a CSR initiative. At the moment this initiative is being carried out with the active support of Hotel Marriot, Miramar, Panaji.

Evidence of success: Five farmers have taken advantage of the programme.

II: Setting up Vegetable Garden:

Goal: To promote organic vegetable farming in the college and make the surrounding area self-sufficient in vegetable produce.

Context: Pilar is situated in a rural area and the college has a large area which is conducive for growing fruits and vegetables. With growing concerns on the quality of the vegetables arriving in the state that are laden with hazardous chemical pesticides, the C.R.E.S.T Department of the college took up the mission of creating awareness about the harmful effects of consuming pesticide laden vegetables and fruits and the team of college students have been instrumental in setting up an organic vegetable gardens in the college premises.

Practice: The student volunteers took up the initiative of setting up vegetable gardens in Pilar with the expertise put in by the experts from Ela Farm and I.C.A.R Old Goa who have funded the project by sponsoring plants, seeds and fruit trees required for setting up the vegetable gardens. The student volunteers were also trained in maintaining the gardens. Particular care is taken to avoid the use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides.

Evidence of success: There are requests from various people in the Panchayat to assist them in setting up such vegetable gardens in their homes.

Problems encountered: Initially, the villagers are reluctant to provide space for setting the gardens. They are doubtful about the quality of seeds, maintenance of the gardens and also about the expenses to be incurred.

III: Earn while you learn:

The College provides employment to deserving needy students. The students work after their lectures in library and IGNOU Study Centre Pilar. Students were also provided with

a stipend for their services rendered at the *Peace Concert* held on 10th December 2017. Through the Career & Placement Cell students were also employed at Timezone, Caculo Mall, S.J. Enterprises, Jaya Hardware, Fitness Five, Happy kids and Casa J. D. Fernandes.

Programmes initiated in the previous years continued:

I: Nurturing innovation among students

The College conducts an intercollegiate program entitled '*Impetus*'. The programme comprises of various competitions which are designed to enhance the abilities and skills such as Observation, Analysis, Application, Creativity, Marketing and Management.

II: Financial assistance schemes for students

Objective of the Practice: The aim of this practice is to provide the financial support to the meritorious and the needy students.

The Context: The students admitted to the College are from diverse backgrounds. Keeping to the motto of the College, students not capable of paying tuition and other fees due to financial conditions are required to be supported for continuing their higher education. In view of this, the College has instituted the Student Aid Fund for such students.

The Practice: At the beginning of every academic year, the college puts up a list on the Notice Board of all the financial schemes available. The students apply for financial assistance accordingly. At the time of application, they need to submit their Academic Progress Report as well as proof of their family income and Caste Certificate. Based on the submitted documents, students are shortlisted for the interview for the Students Aid Fund. The Welfare Committee appointed by the college conducts interviews of these students and a list of students eligible for financial assistance is displayed.

Evidence of Success: Over the years students have benefited from this initiative. 95 students benefitted through the financial assistance schemes.

Problem Encountered and Resources Required: Very often Students do not avail of the scheme. More fund allocation is required for supporting meritorious and needy students.

BEST PRACTICE - I

OKDAAM -2018: A Eco-Wellness Initiative

In keeping with the national objective of promoting AYUSH and natural wellness, ‘Okdaam 2018’ was organized by the Centre for Research and Excellence between Society and Technology (CREST), on 17th February 2018. The event which is an eco-wellness entrepreneurship workshop aims to imbibe knowledge of traditional and natural medicinal practices among students and community for a healthy body and mind. Two sessions were conducted by experts, the Pope John Paul-II Memorial Lecture was delivered by Dr. Amit Dias on the topic “*Soul Connection for a Healthy Feeling*” and Dr. Archana Dessai and her team from Goa Medical College conducted an interactive session on the theme “*Preserving Healthy Habits in Modern Era*”.

As part of the event an OKDAAM garden and OKDAAM farm for medicinal plants was inaugurated in the College. As part of the Fr. Inacio Almeida Memorial Workshop, Fr. Mario Rebello sfx, Director, Jagruti Nature Farm, Valpoi, demonstrated how tilling of the soil is done and organic manure mixed with soil. Medicinal plants will be cultivated and farm looked after by the students as part of practical farming activity. An interesting part of the workshop was a healthy cooking session by Fr. Joaquim Rebello, sfx, Principal, Guardian Angel Institute of Hotel Management and his team which included the Head Chef, Mr. Raymond D’souza. They demonstrated two healthy recipes for the students and emphasised on importance of a healthy diet and things to keep in mind for healthy cooking and eating habits at home especially among youth.

- Introduction of a Short term certificate course on Farm Management under the Executive Grade Programme of the college.
- Introduction of a short term certificate course on diet & nutritious food preparation in collaboration with Guardian Angel Institute of Hotel Management.

BEST PRACTICE-II

INDIA PEACE CONCERT-2017: Initiative to put Peace on Centre Stage

A new initiative to engage neighbourhood and to put peace on centre stage was launched on December 10, 2017, World Human Rights Day, namely, “INDIA PEACE CONCERT-2017” with the theme *'Peace in the Midst of a Storm'*. The Village Panchayats of St. Andre Constituency were roped in as Peace Partners. The event included a concert written by our ex-student Womkop Tonglim, focusing on the Girl Child, her rights and her dreams. This concert provided a platform to 200 students including from our college and primary students from Central School Pilar, to showcase their various talents while promoting the message of peace and harmony in a world ravaged by violence and hatred. The College band ‘Fr. Agnel College Rhythm Vibes’ excelled in backing a 100 member choir consisting of students from Fr. Agnel Central School Pilar, Fr. Agnel College Choral Society and some professionals ex-students such as Melvyn Noronha, Devashish Mujumdar, Baby Gurung, Sheryl Fernandes, Placido Fernandes and Ludovic Fernandes.

Taking a step forward, the College in collaboration with the surrounding village Panchayats felicitated 110 meritorious girls from the neighbouring village wards and awarded them for their educational achievements. National Peace awards were also handed out to four Peace Leaders from different fields for making a positive difference to society. The persons awarded were Sr. Lourenca Marques sfx (social work), Fr. Jerry Fernandes sfx (music), Ms. Tara Kerkar (social work) and Mr. Prisonio Tavares, (literature).

On this occasion, two books were also released: ‘*SasnacheyMhurtik*’ - a compilation of poems written by Mr. Prisonio Tavares while he was in prison as part of Goa's freedom struggle. His poems were compiled and converted in Roman and Devnagari script of Konkani by Assistant Professor Carina Vaz and Assistant Professor Jayesh A. Raut. The second book released was '*Pathanateya*' a book of street plays written by Assistant Professor Jayesh A. Raut.

- An initiative to engage neighbourhood especially the Village Panchayats of the Constituency in college activities.
- Recognizing merit in the neighbouring village wards and awarding them.
- Awarding National Peace awards to Peace Leaders from different fields making a positive difference to society.
- Encouraging publication by teachers.

7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection

The College has taken a lot of positive measures to maintain the campus eco-friendly. Some of the initiatives in this direction are as follows:

Energy Conservation:

- Notices regarding switching off fans, lights computers and other electrical appliances when not in use are placed throughout the campus to avoid wastage of energy. Besides the College has instituted a prize for the Best Civic Sense class.
- Architecture of the College buildings is such that most classrooms have natural light.

Efforts for Carbon neutrality:

- Segregation of wet and dry waste undertaken. The College maintains a Vermicomposting pit for decomposing wet and biodegradable waste.
- Dry leaves and waste papers are not allowed to be put on fire in campus.
- The college campus has a number of trees which helps to achieve carbon neutrality.
- In the college campus the C.R.E.S.T along with the students have started a vegetable garden which is being maintained by the students.
- To create awareness on the importance of tree plantation, the college conducted plantation drive with the help of students. In addition to this, the NSS unit of the college carried out tree plantation during the trek.
- Bins are set up in College lab to collect e-waste. This helps to create awareness on e-waste among students. E-waste is collected and given to an authorized agency for dismantling and recycling as per NPCB norms.

Environmental Quality:

- A course entitled “*Environmental Studies*” is introduced in the FY-BA/BCom/BCA curriculum which helps to create awareness about NEP (National Environmental Policy), Carbon Foot print Verification (ISO 14064), Environmental management (ISO 14001), Environmental impact assessment, Green building etc.
- Through NSS unit and ‘Eco-wellness’ club, various activities related to preserving the environment are organized from time to time.
- The College promotes paperless academic/administrative functioning. Some examples are: online attendance record taken daily; students submit assignments in CD format/online; online students’ feedback for teaching-learning process; circulation of notices via e-mail; library bulletin / College newsletter sent via email
- To create/generate environmental quality awareness, various activities are organized. Some of the activities are as follows:
 - Sprinklers are used on campus.

- Lectures on 'plastic waste management', poster exhibition on environmental issues; students are encouraged to participate in competitions related to environment.
- Low flush toilets are used in college buildings.
- Waste water utilization is done for garden trees.
- Biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste is segregated and bio degradable waste is used for compost.

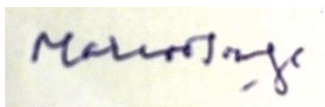
