Ven. Fr. Agnelo De Souza

Early Life - Fr Agnelo, was born at Anjuna, Goa on 21st January, 1869. His parents had nine children, among whom Agnelo was the sixth child. He grew up manifesting qualities of gentleness, of love and purity, humility and obedience combined with a strong sense of self-discipline. Teaching catechism to the boys was his favourite childhood hobby. When he was eleven, his parents died suddenly. As his mother was dying, she entrusted her children to the care of Mary, Mother of Jesus.

Call - Fr Agnelo pursued a call to the priesthood. He studied philosophy and theology at the Patriarchal Seminary, Rachol. He aimed at cultivating assiduously all the priestly virtues. He was ordained as Priest on 24th September, 1898.

Pilar Missionary - As a member of the Society of Pilar, it took him to Shiroda and Sanvordem in Goa, besides Kumta near Karwar. He left in all these places a memorable legacy of his holy living and pastoral concern. He had an intense devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and spent a few hours each night in adoration.

Spiritual Guide - Fr Agnelo was appointed as the Spiritual Director of the Patriarchal Seminary of Rachol. He came to be known as a model priest- humble, prayerful, self-denying and saintly- by the professors and students in the seminary.

Holy Death - Fr Agnelo died on the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus which was on 20th November, 1927. He collapsed on the pulpit towards the end of the sermon. He died and was buried in Rachol. The parish priest who buried him said these words 'I have just laid a saint to rest'. His remains were brought to Pilar on 10th January, 1939. He was declared venerable by the Vatican on 10th November, 1986.

About the College



Fr. Agnel College was established in June 1991 by the Xaverian Educational Society, Pilar, and belongs to the Society of Missionaries of St. Francis Xavier, which is commonly known as the Society of Pilar. The College is a Minority Institution founded under the provision of Article 30(I) of the Indian Constitution.

Location:

The College is located at the foot of the picturesque Pilar hillock in the North District of Goa. Pilar has its own importance in Goa's history as it was the capital city of Goa (prior to Old Goa & Panaji) and it was known as 'Govapuri' or 'Gopakapattana' during the Kadamba reign.

The College is located centrally on the map of Goa. It is situated about 300 mts away from the National Highway 66. It is 13 kms away from Panaji, the capital city of Goa and 22 kms from Margao, the commercial capital of Goa. The College is about 16.5 kms from the international airport at Dabolim.

The total campus area of the College is about 9 acres.

University Grants Commission

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009

(under Section 26(1)(g) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956)

In order to curb the bad practices such as ragging on the College campus the College authorities are committed to strictly take serious actions on the matter as supported by the law and follow UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 (<http://www.ugc.ac.in/page/ragging-related-circulars.aspx>) as well as Goa Prohibition of Ragging Act, 2008 and the amendments carried out thereafter.

Ragging: Prohibition, Prevention and Punishment

The University Grants Commission vide its letter no F.1-16/2007 (CPP-II) dated June 17, 2009 has reiterated the ban on ragging of students in Institutions of Higher Learning. The students are therefore directed to strictly desist from any kind of ragging.

Forms of Ragging: Display of noisy, disorderly conduct, teasing, excitement by rough or rude treatment or handling, including rowdy, undisciplined activities which cause or likely to cause annoyance, undue hardship, physical or psychological harm or raise apprehensive fear in a fresher, or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such a student will not do in the ordinary course and which causes him/her shame or embarrassment or danger to his/her life, etc.

Punishment for Participation in/or Abetment of Ragging :

1. Cancellation of admission.
2. Suspension from attending classes.
3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
5. Withholding results.
6. Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
7. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
8. Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to 4 semesters or equivalent period.
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
- 10 Fine up to Rs. 25,000/-

Affidavit by students and parents (specimen will be provided to students and/or available on College website)

Each student and his/her parents/ guardian shall have to furnish an affidavit alongwith the application form to the effect that they will not participate in or abet the act of ragging and that, if found guilty, shall be liable for punishment under the penal law of India.

What constitutes Ragging : -

Ragging constitutes one or any of the follows acts:-

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student. with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Action to be taken by the Head of the institution : -

On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of Institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorized by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- i Abetment to ragging;
- i. Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- ii. Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- iii. Public nuisance created during ragging;
- iv. Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- v. Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- vi. Wrongful restraint;
- vii. Wrongful confinement;
- viii. Use of criminal force;
- ix. Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences;
- x. Extortion;
- xi Criminal trespass;
- xii. Offences against property;

- xiii. Criminal intimidation;
- xiv. Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- xv. Threat to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- xvi. Physical or psychological humiliation;
- xvii. All other offences following from the definition of "Ragging"

Provided that the Head of institution shall forthwith report the occurrence of the incident of ragging to the District Level Anti-Ragging Committee and the Nodal officer of the affiliating University, if the institution is an affiliated institution.

Provided further that the institution shall also continue with its own enquiry initiated under clause 9 of these Regulations and other measures without waiting for action on the part of the police/local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately and in no case later than a period of seven days of the reported occurrence of the incident of ragging.

Administrative action in the event of ragging: -

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed hereinunder:-

- a) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
 - i. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - ii. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
 - iii. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
 - iv. Withholding results.
 - v. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
 - vi. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
 - vii. Cancellation of admission
 - viii. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
 - ix. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

Provided that whether the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

- c) An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie,
 - i. In case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice Chancellor of the University.
 - ii. In case of an order of University, to its Chancellor
 - iii. In case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Principal of the institution, as the case may be.

Admissions - Eligibility Criteria

Eligibility for admission to Semester I & II (in the First Year) **B. A./B.Com Programme:**

- (A) To be eligible for admission to the Semester I of the Three Years Programme leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Arts/ Commerce/ Commerce (Hon.) the candidate should have passed:
- (i) The Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in any stream, including Vocational stream in the subjects notified by the University from time to time.



OR

- (ii) Std XII Arts/Science/Commerce or similar examination of another body, equivalent to Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Goa, and recognized as such by Goa University.
- (B) A candidate not covered under any of the above categories but desirous of seeking admission to the said course may apply to the College. However, the Registrar along with Dean of concerned Faculty and Chairperson(s) of Board(s) of Studies of concerned subjects shall decide the eligibility.
- (C) A candidate admitted for Semester-I shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester-II.
- (D) A candidate migrating from another recognized University and desirous of direct admission to Semester-II may be considered for admission provided he/she has cleared/passed First Term/ Semester-I examination of that University with those subjects for which admission is sought and undertakes to successfully complete the other compulsory Courses of Semester-I.
- (E) Provisional Certificate copy from other University

Eligibility for admission to Semester I & II (in the First Year) **B. C. A. Programme:**

For *BCA* programme admission eligibility criteria from points A to E as shown above remains the same. In addition, if required a candidate may have to answer an entrance test. The entrance test shall assess the general aptitude, logical reasoning, analytical abilities and basic arithmetic skills of the candidate.

College Library : The College Library has open access and is fully computerized with the help of NewGenLib library software. The library has over 21800 printed books, 64 print journals and magazines, 9 Newspapers , one e-news paper, 6000+ electronic journals, 51000+ e-books and bibliographic databases. The library has also bought books in braille for visually challenged students. The library also has books/reading material available on kindle

The Library has its own website <http://faclibrary.weebly.com> (can be accessed on College website too). The students can access digital documents such as syllabi, questions papers, power-point presentations, notes and other information.

The students who have scored 60% and above marks in their previous examination are given additional library card. i.e. SCHOLAR CARD. Students belonging to SC/ST/OBC class are given one additional Library Card. i.e. SOCIAL CARD. Minority students too have the facility of an extra card.

A Book Bank facility is available exclusively for the economically challenged students.

The Library offers the college students, a free of cost, 2 credit course to learn multi-disciplinary subjects. The students who wish to complete the course have to spend minimum 30 hours of work during a free lecture or any time during the academic year under the guidance of the College Librarian. The students will be given basic training in the field of Library and Information Science.

New Library Building: College has a new block for its Library to accommodate more number of books/ material as well as seating capacity for its readers. The new Library building will be open for the public too for leisure reading

Counselling: A professional Counsellor is available for the benefit of the students. The Counselling services are available throughout the week (Motivational talks are also organized).

Mentoring Scheme: The success and strength of an educational institution lies mainly in its students. Students thus need to be given all possible attention and support. To achieve this goal, the College has a mentoring scheme, wherein different lecturers are assigned for different groups of students. The concerned lecturer to that group acts as guide and mentor.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Students particularly from the underprivileged category and financially challenged are provided with the below mentioned scholarships and financial assistance to pursue higher education

Dayanand Bandodkar Scheme for Higher Education for Orphans

Eligibility:

- The beneficiaries under the scheme should be orphaned.
- He / She should have passed his/her qualifying examination from any of the institutions located in Goa.
- He / She should be born in Goa or a resident of Goa for atleast last fifteen (15) years.

Post Matric Scholarship for Students belonging to the Minority (Christian, Muslim, Sikh, Parsi etc)Communities

Eligible students who wish to apply for the above mentioned Scholarships are required to fill in the form online by going to the following website www.momascholarship.gov.in after filling the form online they have to take a print out and submit the form along with the necessary documents in the office.

Eligibility

- Marks not less than 50% in the previous year's examination.
- Annual Income from all sources from student's parents or guardian should not exceed Rs.2 lakhs per year from all sources for Post Matric Scholarship. Students from BPL families having less income will be given preference in ascending order.
- 30% of scholarships reserved for girl students.
- Scholarship not to be given to more than two students in a family.
- Students who are studying in the present academic year can apply or are eligible.
- The scholarship holder under this scheme will not avail any other scholarship / stipend for the same course.

Fr. Agnel College Students' Aid Fund

Criteria

- Income of parents / guardian of the applicant students should not exceed Rs. 2 lakh per annum
- Students should have passed previous year's examination.

Post Matric Scholarship to the SC/OBC Students

Documents to be submitted along with Application Form:

- Caste Certificate issued by Sub-Divisional Magistrate of State of Goa (Caste Certificate for OBC Community is valid for 3 years from date of issue).
- Total Income Certificate from all sources issued in favour of head of family. (Family ceiling: SC-Rs.2.50 lakh per annum, OBC – Rs. 1 Lakh per annum)
- Receipt of fees paid for the current year.
- Educational Certificates / Mark Sheets for preceding 3 years.
- Photograph
- Aadhar Card Copy

Students applying under Post Matric Scholarship Scheme are instructed to open an SB Account in any Scheduled / Nationalised Bank in the vicinity of the College. The amount of scholarship will be directly credited to the Bank Account of the student.

Educational Concession to the Children of Service Personnel Terms and Conditions

- Children of “Service Personnel” means and includes Combatant Junior Commissioned Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and other lower ranks in the army and officers and personnel of the corresponding status in the Air Force and the Navy are eligible.
- Service Certificate of the Parent is mandatory.
- Application should be only in prescribed form.
- Only original fee receipt will be considered.
- Decision of the Service Office regarding finalization of the upper limit of the reimbursement of the Tuition Fee will be final.
- Photocopy of the mark sheet of the previous exam held, attested by the Principal / Gazetted Officer, should be attached to the application.

Educational Concession to the Children of Freedom Fighters

Note: Freedom Fighters including son/daughter, the grand children i.e. the children of his/her deceased son/ son-in-law provided the grand children are dependent on him / her, “the adopted children”, “Step children for education concession under this scheme.

Condition:

- Student should not be employed.
- Should not be a recipient of any other scholarship.
- Should have secured promotion in the next higher class.

Post Matric Scholarship to ST Students

Document to be submitted at the time of Application Form:

- Attested copy of Caste / Status Certificate issued by Deputy Collector.
- Income certificate issued by competent authority.
- Receipt of fees paid for the current year.
- Marks Sheet of last annual examination passed.
- A copy of Nationalised Bank Pass Book of the student.

Fee Waiver Scheme for SC/ST students pursuing Higher Education

The beneficiaries under the scheme shall be entitled to receive full waiver of the fees supposed to have been paid by them. The amount of fee waiver provided to the eligible students shall consist of Tuition Fees, Library fees, Laboratory fees and Development fees, if any. All other charges and fees would be borne by the concerned student.

Eligibility:-

- Any student seeking fee waiver under the scheme should have been born in Goa or a resident of Goa for at least 15 years.
- He/She must have passed his / her qualifying examination from any of the institutions located in Goa.
- He / she should belong to SC/ST community of Goa.

Scheme of Higher Education for Gouly Students

Under the scheme the students of Dhangar (Gouly) community notified as OBC and whose family income do not exceed Rs.1.50 lakh per annum are eligible under the scheme. An amount of Rs.25000/- will be sanctioned by way of fixed deposit and pay them the same amount along with accrued interest after passing degree courses in any faculty. In case the student fail or drops out the beneficiaries inform that the student is re-appearing the examination, money will be kept in fixed deposit till next academic year or till he / she passes the degree examination whichever is earlier.

Eligibility:

Under the scheme the students of Dhangar (Gouly) community notified as OBC who after passing XIIth std or equivalent examination and secure admission in the first year degree course and whose family income does not exceed Rs.1.50 lakh per annum are eligible under the scheme.

Dr. Ambedkar Post-matric Scholarship to E.B.C. Students

Conditions for Fresh Scholarship:

- Income of his / her parents / guardian from all sources should not exceed Rs.1 lakh

- per annum.
- Income Certificate should be submitted from the competent authority in the State / Union territory.
- He / She has to secure a minimum of 45% marks at the last year qualifying examination.
- Student should be studying in the First Year of the stage of education.
- He / She should be a resident of the State of Goa (15 years domicile).
- Only one student of E.B.C. family can avail of the scholarships. To this effect a declaration from the parents / guardian that only one family member is availing of the benefit is to be enclosed with the application form.
- Rate of Scholarship is Rs.900/- per student p.a.

Scholarship for Differently Abled Students

The criteria for eligibility under this scheme are that:

- The student should possess a minimum disability for 40% duly certified by Medical Board.
- The student should have secured a minimum 45% marks in the previous annual examination.
- The annual income of parents of the students should not exceed Rs.1,20,000/- p.a. from all the sources.
- Identity Card issued by Directorate of Social Welfare, Panaji – Goa.

Merit Based Award (SC/ST/Dhangar Students)

Students who secure 50% and above in HSSC is eligible

Gagan Bharari Shiksha Yojana for Dhangar Students (SC/ST)

Eligibility Criteria:

Dhangar student whose family income is less than 2 lakhs is eligible under the scheme.

Benefit under the Scheme:

- Additional Maintenance allowance of Rs.750/- p.m. for Day Scholar and Rs.1500/- p.m. for those staying in Hostel during the academic year (for ten months).
- Additional disability allowance of Rs. 750/- p.m. during the academic year (for ten months).

The Bursary Scheme

Criteria:

Students pursuing College (Higher and Professional) Education in the State of Goa including Post Graduation shall be eligible to receive the benefit under the Bursary Scheme provided they meet the eligibility criteria laid down in the Scheme.

Conditions:

The concerned students shall pay the requisite fees for the course that he /she pursues. The eligible quantum of fees shall be reimbursed to him through direct transfer his Bank Account. In order to be a beneficiary under the scheme, the student should have completed his / her Xth and XIIth and Graduation in case of Post Graduation students, from an institution in Goa. In case of Post Graduate Course, the requirement of graduate degree from college/ University from Goa, will be relaxed for degree from Central university, NIIT, IIT and other Statutorily created Institution.

The annual income of both parent(s) / guardian taken together should be less than Rupees Three Lakhs per annum.

The maximum amount of grant shall be restricted to Rs.40,000/- per annum. Only those cases where the total course / programme fees do not exceed Rs.60,000/- per annum shall be considered under the scheme. Those with course fees above Rs.60,000/- may approach the GEDC for Loans under Interest Free Loan Scheme.

The benefits under the scheme shall not be available to those who are availing financial benefits under any other scheme of Government of Goa.

Dempo Charitable Trust Scholarship

Criteria:

- The Students should be permanently domiciled of St. Cruz and pursuing studies in Goa.

Blue Cross Scholarship

Criteria:

- SSC & HSSC marks should be 65% and above
- Income should be less than 3 lakh rupees
